Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>The Limmud Netherlands day-event took place on Sunday April 23rd 2023 in Amstelveen, near Amsterdam, in a community centre with enough classrooms for sessions of different types in parallel. This was the first in-person Limmud event since 2016 and the popularity exceeded expectations - we initially planned for a 51-75 people event, and the attendance doubled the prognosis. Sessions took place between 10.30 and 6pm. There were 5 time-slots during the day, with 5 or 6 sessions to choose from in each slot. The underlying programmatic concept was the value of Expanding Jewish Horizons. The range of sessions and topics therefore was very broad, including history, religion, politics, identity and dance. In each time-slot there was a choice between sessions in Dutch and in English. In between sessions there were short breaks for coffee, tea and social interaction. A kosher lunch was provided in the middle of the day.</p> <p>Many session had a lively audience and interesting discussions. A great and well attended highlight of the day was the workshop about klezmer music with the title "Klezmer for dummies and other musical menschn" given by the professional band The Klezmer Society. In addition the Jewish Jazz concert at the end of the day was a success, also because it was given in the foyer/bar, so it gave the opportunity to the audience to socialise and to review the day.</p>
